Get your group together today. Spots will go fast!

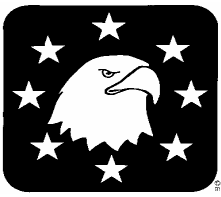

Mayor's Message



Residents of Crestview Hills:

During the coming months, the City of Crestview Hills' Recreation Committee has a few activities planned. In addition to our last Cincinnati Reds game on July 16, and a day trip to Renfro Valley to see Carl Hurley on Friday, November 4, we are excited to host our fourth annual Crestview Hills City Picnic and Golf Outing, which will be held at Summit Hills Country Club, on Tuesday August 9th. We had a great turnout last year and hope to have even more residents and businesses participate this year.

Beginning July 1, advanced life support services will be handled a little differently. The City will still pay the subscription to Trans Care so there will be uninterrupted service to our residents and businesses. However, Trans Care will bill and collect payment from each patient's primary and secondary insurers. Then patients will be billed in 2 consecutive billing cycles subsequent to receiving insurance payments for any balance. Please do not panic upon receiving these billings but contact the City for further instructions. Trans Care has been forced to change it's operations so it can continue to serve Northern Kentucky.

As stated in the last newsletter, the City has hired CDS Associates, Inc. to design the new Crestview Hills City/Police Building located next to our current building. As we looked to provide space for the Lakeside Park-Crestview Hills Police Authority and providing space for the City, it was determined that the best plan was to build a new building. These plans are going forward and we hope to break ground by the end of August. The City has saved for this for many years and our police are looking forward to their new space.

The new Town Center continues to move along and will have a mix of retail and dining opportunities. Management has stated that the drive around buildings adjacent to I-275, should be open in mid July. Many of our businesses and residents can use it to get freely to TGI Fridays, Applebees, Carrabbas, Panera Bread, or Max and Erma's. The Crestview Hills Town Center is expected to be open October 27th. Visit www.shopcrestviewhillstowncenter.com for more information.

PUBLIC WORKS NEWS

The City is presently working on many Public Works projects. Centre View Blvd. has recently been repaved from Thomas More Parkway to Chancellor Drive. Also, many catch basins have been repaired in the Lookout Farm and College Park areas. Future summer projects include the repaving of Parkway Drive, gutter and curb repair on Campus and University Drives, and the replacement of six concrete slabs on Man-O-War Drive.

With the scheduled opening of the Crestview Hills Town Center on October 27th, the City's Public Works Committee is trying to be proactive in addressing issues that may cause traffic problems. We have just completed extending the stacking lane from the exit ramp on Turkeyfoot Road to Mall Road. We are also looking at remedies to alleviate traffic problems on Dixie Highway from the I-275 exit ramps to both Town Center entrances.

The City is also working with the State Transportation Department, the Kenton County School Board, and Sanitation District #1 to alleviate a drainage problem on Summit Drive, from Caywood School to Dixie Highway. It is our hope that these and other projects can be completed during this construction season.

IN SUPPORT OF OUR TROOPS

We would like to take this opportunity to thank the many residents, city representatives, schools, and civic organizations who have contributed, in one way or another, to sending "care" packages to our adopted troop, Alpha Company, 1st Platoon of the 82nd Airborne Division, from Ft. Bragg, N.C. Thus far, we have mailed 80 boxes of goods to Iraq. The City has committed to the collecting, packing, and paying the cost of mailing the packages. If we receive monetary donations, all of that money is used to buy goods, such as telephone calling cards and "fun food" (chips, beef jerky, candy, etc.)

Our adopted troop was deployed in December, 2004, and probably won't return until December, 2005, or January, 2006. Please keep your donations, cards and letters, and goods coming. We have been told that if they receive extra items, they share them with other troops. Again, thank to all who have participated and to those who will participate in the future.
