

LAKESIDE PARK-CRESTVIEW HILLS POLICE AUTHORITY BOARD

Regular Meeting – June 21, 2021

CALL TO ORDER: The regular meeting of the Lakeside Park-Crestview Hills Police Authority Board was called to order at 5:30PM by Chairman Paul Markgraf.

ATTENDANCE: Those in attendance were Paul Markgraf, David Kramer, Bill Dorsey and Brian Waite. Also in attendance were Col. Schutte, Clerk Sies & Alex Mattingly.

MINUTES: Mr. Kramer made a motion to accept the May minutes. Mr. Waite seconded. Motion passed unanimously.

FINANCIAL: The May financial statement was reviewed along with the May reconciliations. After a review of the bills, Mr. Dorsey made a motion to pay the bills. Mr. Kramer seconded. Motion passed unanimously.

CHIEF'S REPORT:

- 1.) Lt. Colonel Degenhardt taught a safety class to babysitters @ Lakeside Christian Church.
- 2.) The Car Show on June 5 was very successful. The police department was able to raise a total of \$8,000 for Cincinnati Children's Hospital.
- 3.) Chief Schutte gave an update on the Town Center Riot call from June 2020.
- 4.) The department is seeing an increase in scam calls. Most recently a resident was scammed out of \$22,000. Chief Schutte reported that the department had placed an article in the city's newsletter regarding this exact type of scam. A discussion was held on the circulation of the city's newsletters in electronic format as compared to print format.
- 5.) The two new officers are doing well. They will be completing their Field Training in July. Both officers will be present at the August City Council meetings.

COUNCIL REPORTS:

Crestview Hills – The regular meeting was June 10. Mr. Kramer reported that the city approved some 20-21 budget amendments; and the city approved the FY 2021-2022 budget.

Lakeside Park – The regular meeting was June 14. Mr. Markgraf reported that the city passed an ordinance concerning parking in the city lot; the city adopted the FY 2021-2022 budget; the city-wide garage sale is Saturday, June 26 from 8:00AM to 1:00pm.

OLD BUSINESS:


